 - a) It's been a busy month of meetings and travel even though we are in to July. Thank you to everyone for taking time out of your schedules to join us today

- 5) Reports from Officers (West/Metz)
 - a) Director Tom (for Director Wiese)
 - NTA Acquisition: NTA joins the Code Council family. The acquisition adds laboratory and testing capabilities and will streamline the time-to-market for product manufacturers.  - ii) Coded Systems Acquisition. On July 1, New Jersey-based Coded Systems has merged with General Code, a member of the Code Council family of solutions. The merged companies, operating as General Code, will support the growing needs of code officials, municipal planners and zoning officials by providing expanded product offerings and digital solutions.  - iii) President Bryant has formed an initiative to explore remote voting for ICC Directors and by-law changes. Currently, voting on Code Council business is limited to members attending the annual business meeting. Members of the board have been working on this issue. A committee has been formed and is chaired by Director Wich.

The committee is exploring available options around moving toward electronic voting that would allow more members to participate. No significant updates are anticipated at this year's business meeting. The committee's work continues.

- iv) Proposed ICC by-law change submitted by State of New York
 - (a) The Code Council's board leadership is organized by section. The membership is represented by an 18-member board comprised of (4) executive committee members, (6) sectional directors, and 8 at-large directors. The geographical sections are defined on page 3 of the Code Council by-laws which can be viewed <u>here</u>.
 - (b) The proposal in front of the membership is to move away from board organization by geographic section and to move to a regional voting model comprised of 12 regions. The regional voting model would organize the board as follows: (4) executive committee members, (12) regional directors, and 2 at-large directors.
 - (c) Key issues for consideration:
 - (i) Under the current model, no more than 2 directors can be elected per state. The proposed new model would shift the board to no more than 2 directors per region.
 - (ii) Under the current model, (8) board seats are reserved for the election of (8) at-large directors. The proposed new model would shift (6) of the at-large directors to regional directors, leaving (2) seats designated for at-large directors.
 - (d) The by-law change proposal will go in front of the Code Council membership for consideration the annual business meeting in Las Vegas. Once a quorum of eligible voting members is reach, the measure will require a 2/3 majority of voting members present at the annual business meeting to pass.
 - (e) The full by-law change proposal is included as an attachment to the July minutes for your review and consideration.

- v) Will be representing the Code Council July 29-31 in Madison, WI in a meeting hosted by the Association of State Floodplain Managers (ASFPM) to discuss further developing post-disaster building damage assessment capabilities and capacity with FEMA and other state and local officials.

Proposed Amendment to the Bylaws for the International Code Council, Inc. A California Nonprofit Public Benefit Corporation **Revised February 2013**

ARTICLE IV — GEOGRAPHICAL REPRESENTATION

4.1 Limitations - To encourage wide geographical representation, no more than two Governmental Member Representatives designated by Governmental Members located in the same state may serve simultaneously on any one committee nor may more than two Governmental Members Representatives designated by Governmental Members located in the same state serve simultaneously on the Board of Directors. Beginning at the 2021 Annual Business Meeting and thereafter, no more than two Governmental Members Representatives designated by Governmental Members located in the same Region may serve on the Board of Directors.

4.2	Distribution - To provide for geographical representation on the Board of Directors, the following

ARTICLE V — BOARD OF DIRECTORS

5.1 Governing Body - Subject to the limitations of the Articles of Incorporation, these Bylaws and the laws of the State of California, all corporate powers shall be exercised by the Board of Directors. The Board of Directors shall be composed of the following: President, Vice President, Secretary/Treasurer, the most Immediate Past President eligible; eight (8) Directors-at-Large, and six (6) and fourteen (14) <u>Regional Directors, with at least</u> one elected from each Section Region ("Sectional Regional Directors"). In the event that there is no candidate for a Regional seat, any Governmental Member Representative from any Region may be elected to that seat in accordance with the limitations of 4.1 of Article IV of these <u>Bylaws</u>. Each member of the Board of Directors, except as provided in the Bylaws, shall be elected for a term of three years, and shall not serve for more than two consecutive full terms. However, nothing in this section shall preclude a Director initially appointed to a one or two year term, or appointed or elected to fill an unexpired term, from being elected to two subsequent full term(s). Each Sectional Regional Director shall be and remain, throughout his or her term, a Governmental Member Representative for a Governmental Member within the applicable Section Region.
