A ballot will go out to both IECC-residential and IECC-commercial voting members to address issue of whether proponents will be allowed to vote on their proposals after the January 5, 2020, full IECC-commercial meeting. ICC wants IECC-residential and IECC-commercial committees to have the same procedure.

- d. Was recommendation that IECC-residential and IECC-commercial committees need to follow similar procedures.

- i. CEPI-30-21 Proponent Martha VanGeem
  - · Suggestion that it be combined with other proposals.
  - Suggestion to remove second sentence in definition
  - Like location of the proposal in the IECC (in C402.1)
  - Concern was expressed that document is not developed in accordance ICC policies for reference standards. Proponent confirmed standard was

- ii. CEPI-33-21 Proponent Jay Crandall
  - Question of copyright issue with ASHRAE, Proponent confirmed language is original that builds on information from multiple sources.
  - · Review of structure and organization for better clarity is needed
  - Suggestion that exceptions be rewritten as requirement options.
  - Thermal bridging should be tradeable in the Performance path
  - Request to see analysis for Climate zone 0-3 exceptions.
  - Request to revisit cost effectiveness statement
  - Suggest analysis be done on proposal
- iii. CEPI-40-21 Proponent Paula Zimin
  - Concern about adding a requirement as a footnote
  - Encourage review of unmitigated Y-factors that seem low.
  - Where do designers get Y-factors?
  - · Question about size of point thermal bridges
- iv. CEPI-45-21 Proponent Helen Sanders
  - Some clean up of language is needed.
  - Support for performance approach that varies by climate zone
- g. Air leakage: did not have time to get into discussion of air leakage proposals. These will move forward to agenda for next meeting (Jan. 6, 2022). Chair / Vice-chair will group proposals on agenda to allow some of the standalone items to be addressed first.
