Motion to approve as modified by Emma Gonzalez-Laders and second by Mary Koban. Reason: radiant barriers help reduce heat transfer and installation standard is needed. Motion to approve passes 32-1.
- p. REPI-42-21 (Radiant Barrier). Proponent Wesley Hall. Introduction by Emma Gonzalez-Laders, Chair of Envelope subcommittee. Motion to approve as modified by Emma Gonzalez-Laders and second by Mary Koban. Reason: provides useful definition on reflective insulation and emittance. Motion to approve passes 30-3.
