The design moisture content shall be equal to the moisture content determined and certified by methods prescribed by an accredited third-party grading agency.</p> <p>Reason: The committee agreed with the intent of the proposal, but modified the language to further clarify the requirements for moisture content on grade marks.</p>				

2. Ballot Comment to item IS-LOG 10.1-17 (Dave Conner):

Revise as follows:

302.2.1.3 Grade marks. Grade marks or Certificates of Inspection shall include the following information:

1. Name or registered trade mark of the accredited grading agency.
2. Name or identification number of the manufacturer.
3. Species of logs.
4. Grade name or designation.
5. ~~Labeled~~ Moisture content at time of grading. If the moisture content is not included on the grade

mark or certificate, then the moisture content shall be assumed to be green for all design calculations where moisture content is a factor.

302.2.2.1.2 Labeled Certified specification. The design moisture content shall be equal to the moisture content determined and certified by methods prescribed by an accredited third-party grading agency.

Note: Section 302.2.2.1.2 reverts back to its original 2012 language.

Reason: The proposed revision is the most transparent way to describe the marketplace's current practice of labeling at this time. I suggest this verbiage while pointing out that the heading of section 302.2.1.3 is "Grade marks", not "Moisture content". Section 302.2.2 "Moisture content" stands on its own and does a good job in describing the different types of moisture content that can be referenced at different stages of a log's "moisture life cycle" (Prescriptive vs certified/calculated, Design MC vs Service MC).
