## **Nicholas Hill**

Chief Executive, Building Officials Institute of New Zealand

Nick Hill is the Chief Executive of the Building Officials Institute of New Zealand (BOINZ), the peak body representing the Building Surveying sector which includes building controls, building inspection and specialist property inspection. The Institute is dedicated to improving the quality and performance of the built environment.

Nick is also the Chair of the Australasian Certification Authority for Reinforced and Structural Steels (ACRS) since 2017 and been a director since 2013. ACRS is the leading and most technically rigorous, internationally aligned steel certifier to Australian and New Zealand Standards. The independence of ACRS' auditing process provides certainty of no commercial affiliation and that its certification of constructional steel is truly impartial.

Nick Is a Life Member and Past President of the Australasian Society of Association Executives (AuSAE), with operations in both Australia and New Zealand to support and enhance the value of the association sector and its executives. Nick co-led the merger between the Australian and New Zealand organisations culminating the Australasian organisation being formed in 2011.

Nick's other roles and responsibilities include: - executive member of New Zealand's Construction Industry Council (CIC); Wellington District Councillor for the New Zealand Automobile Association (NZAA); and an industry representative or board member on a number New Zealand's Ministry of Business Innovation and Employment's Advisory Groups. He is a sitting Council member of the International Code Council's (ICC), Global Management Council (GMC) headquartered in the US and has been previously held positions on the GMC as Vice Chair and Secretary. Nick has also consulted in the areas of business management and franchising.

Nick has previously held general management and senior leadership roles within GEC (NZ) Ltd and the Motor Trade Association of New Zealand as well as industry representative, advisory and chairing roles over a wide range of motor industry regulatory and project areas. He was also a board member of the New Zealand Masonry Trades Registration Board Incorporated and chaired an industry group to standardise odometer certification for used imported vehicles into New Zealand.

Nick's sector exposure includes industrial chemicals, illumination engineering, electrical wholesaling, construction, and the motor industry.
