4.0 Group B Codes: Work Group (WG) Reports – Review results of the 2013 Code Development Hearings for Group B code changes (AHC submittals as well as others related to AHC scope) and develop AHC Public Comments (due July 15<sup>th</sup>). (posted)

# **4.1** Combined Work Group Report (all WG's) – Reviewed by WG's with draft comments Significant issues:

- F111 & F109: AHC to submit a public comment to F109 only
- F212: Use the EB26 language in order to coordinate the IFC and IEBC. The difficulty is one
  of having two code changes with similar applications in two different codes. Laundry lists in
  code can cause interpretive problems. Considerable discussion on this item tabled to the
  end of the agenda. Proposed solution is to split out the exception and create a new section.
- F218: Public comments mirror Chapter 4 and are coordinated with Federal requirements
- F219: AHC will not be submitting a public comment
- F295: Support public comment as proposed
- F360: Bob Davidson is slated to submit a public comment to require CO alarms if there is a fireplace

# 4.2 Committee Review Report – Not reviewed by WG's, public comments to be developed by AHC

Significant issues:

- F31, F33, F106, F106, F109: No public comments
- F112: Submit comment to 808.1 based on the modification suggested at the CAH
- F225, F291: No public comment
- F54: A public comment is needed to clarify that protection for the electrical equipment is needed in both new construction as well as existing construction that has seen substantial damage
- F59: No public comment, AM is from the AHC
- EB 26: Public comment to delete the reference to Chapter 9, fire protection is addressed in Section 804.

- F240, F241: No public comments, AM is from the AHC
- F242, EB 36: AM is acceptable. No public comments.

# 5.1 Public Comment Hearings: October 2 – 10, 2013; Atlantic City

Discussion:

- Typical volume for a Public Comment Hearing varies between 30% and 33% of code changes submitted. May result in long hearing days.

  - o E68 issues addressed in E67
  - o E71 issues addressed in E70
  - o E75 issues addressed in E74
  - o E83 issues addressed in E82
  - o E119 issues addressed in E118
  - o E120 issues addressed in E118
- FS 42: Follow up needed
- FS47, 48, 49, 65: See FS 50
- G71: Travel distance in suites needs follow up
- G72, G74: No follow up
- G92, G200: Follow up needed
- FG3: No follow up. This is a CTC care facility issue

### 8.1 Review and update of issues not addressed in 2012/2013 Cycle

AHC discussed the outstanding issues and noted which Work Group is responsible, as follows:

- Means of Egress:
  - o Photoluminescents
  - Two way communication
  - Glow in the dark markings on stairs
  - o Evacuation for all hazards, not just fire
  - Use of elevators in different emergencies
  - o Doors
- General
  - Ambulatory care exit strategies
  - o Egress through smoke compartment of fire origin
- All three WG's (MOE, General, Fire Safety)
  - o Different types of outpatient clinics. What's the occupancy classification
  - Occupancy classification for hospitals with several different types of spaces
  - o On going discussion on qualifying and quantifying "incapable of self preservation"
