1.0 Welcome and introductions

1.1 Chair Williams - Call to order; introductions

4.0 Review 2014 IgCC Code changes related to AHC scope of work (posted) a. Committee Action Hearing: April 27 – May 3, 2014; Memphis

b. Public Comment Hearing: October 1 – 7, 2014; Fort Lauderdale

The committee reviewed the code changes and determined support of the following: GG's: 43, 150, 233, 245, 249, 252, 257, 294 GEW's: 43, 44, 46, 51, 59, 90, 94, 98, 99, 111, 162, 175, 178

Reports for the AHC have been created and posted as follows:

- Report 1: Working meeting reviewing results of the 2012/2013 Code Development Cycle to determine action/workplan, if any, for the 2015/2017 Cycle.
- Report 2: Working meeting to review issues not covered in Report 1 for possible consideration for the 2015/2017 Cycle.

5.0 2015/2017 Cycle Update

ASHE is reviewing their funding scheme for the upcoming cycles. Staff noted the change in code groupings for the upcoming cycles. Of note is that the non-structural provisions of the IEBC will now be in Group A in the 2015 cycle.

6.0 Report 1: Combined Work Group Report (all WG's) (posted)

This will be Fire safety Chair Tom Baldwin's last AHC meeting. The committee congratulated Tom on his pending retirement and thanked him for his participation. Jack Chamblee to take over the Chair position.

The AHC reviewed the report. Of significant note:

- E25, E27, E149: Lighting issues related to KTAGS
- FG3: Need follow-up code change to address issues brought up in testimony at hearings. KTAG related
- G77: Issue resolved by G80
- G92: Smoke compartment size increase not needed in ambulatory care facilities. However,

eed to address small ambulatory care in the middle of a larger building.

- FS42: KTAG related
- Numerous proposals address Section 711.9 which was deleted no change needed
- FS65: Not KTAG related. Compartmentation in hospitals does not need lobbies. Need to work with CTC.
- F31: Floor modification resolves the issue
- F105, F106, F111: Need review of resulting IFC 806 and 807 code text dealing with silk plants and compliance with NFPA 701.
- F112: K75-tag does address wastebaskets over a certain size. This change needed for medical records recycle or hazardous waste disposal
- F219: KTAG covered in F218
- F218, F295: KTAG 134 and OSHA requirement

7.0 Report 2: Combined Work Group Report (all WG's) (posted)

The AHC reviewed the report. Of significant note/high priority:

- Review KTAG list to confirm all issues addressed
- Address fireplaces
- Address smoke partition continuity
- Glow in the dark stripes on stairways in hospitals vs defend in place strategy
- Duct penetrations and fully ducted systems
- Need alternative accessibility provisions for toilet stalls to accommodate care giver assistance to older patients

8.0 Review and identify KTAGS not addressed in Reports 1 and 2 for the 2015 – 2017 Cycle

This agenda item was done prior to item 7. Review of existing hospital KTAGS:

- K17: See code change FS42-12
- K19: IFC includes retroactive sprinklers for hospitals. As such, no restrictions on vision panels in corridor wall and doors in a sprinklered building.
- K24: Of note is the approved code change which expands the compartment to 40, 000 square feet while the LSC still has 22,500 square feet. The equivalence can be found in the 200 travel distance which is the key consideration.
- K32: Review IFC Section 1104 for minimum exits
- K34: Need to confirm
- K35 & K38: K35 covered in IFC 1104.7 and 1031.2
- K36: Need to confirm
- K51: See IFC 907.5.2.3 Exception 4
- K72: Need to confirm there are provisions to address corridor maintenance
- K76: IPC reference NFPA 99 for medical gas storage?
- K77: Need to review which edition of NFPA 99 is referenced
- K143 (a): See IFC 5306.4
- K106: Is NFPA 99 referenced in IFC 604.1 and 1105.10?
- K147: Need reference to NFPA 70 in IFC 605.1 or is the reference covered elsewhere?

Review of existing ambulatory care KTAGS:

• The LSC utilizes a considerable number of provisions based on a Business occupancy. The IFC now includes Appendix K based on approved code change F344-13.
