New agenda Item 7.4 entitled A117.1 was added to the agenda at the request of Jake Pauls.

5. **IAC Administration**
  - 5.1 **Chair’s Report**  
Chair Grill welcomed those in attendance noting the impact of the pandemic on how meetings are now conducted virtually.
6. **IAC Task Group Activities**
  - 6.1 **Cost impact forwarded to the LTCDP and then the Code Council Board**  
The IAC document entitled “ICC Cost Impact Guide” was approved by the Board and posted November 17, 2021.
  - 6.2 **Ethics forwarded to the LTCDP and then the Code Council Board**  
Staff reported that the proposed update of CP37 Ethics was under review by the Board Council Policy Review Committee. Discussion:
    - A request was made to allow members of the LTCDP and IAC interested parties to participate in the discussion when it occurs by the Board committee in order to provide background and be able to answer any questions.
    - A motion for a joint meeting was approved by the IAC.
    - It was noted that the request will be forwarded to Board President Davis.
7. **ICC Codes & Standards Activities**
  - 7.1 **2021 Cycle**

Discussion:

- OGCV preliminary results posted. Results require validation in accordance with Section 10.1 of CP28.

## 7.2 2022 Cycle

Discussion:

- The 2022 Cycle will not include the IECC/Chapter 11 of the IRC as the energy provisions of the I-Codes will now be updated via ICC's standards process and the ICC Consensus Procedures.
- Code changes due January 10, 2022.
- CAH: March 27 – April 6 in Rochester
- PCH: September 14 – 21 in Louisville

## 7.3 Codes and Standards Committee Activities

The following committees are currently active, with meetings being held virtually:

  - Storm Shelters (ICC 500). It was noted that ICC 500 is now under continuous maintenance in an effort to coordinate with the update of ASCE 7
  - Solar Hot Water Storage (ICC 903)
  - Seismic Assessment/Retrofit of existing OTFD's (ICC 1300)
  - A117.1
- Standards being initiated
  - Wildland-Urban Interface (ICC 605) (part of the ICC 60x portfolio of hazard mitigation standards) - NEW
  - Rainwater Collection (ICC 805) - Update
  - Off-Site Construction MEP (Mechanical, Electrical, Plumbing, Energy and Water Conservation) (ICC 1205) – NEW
  - National Green Building Standard (ICC 700)
  - RESNET/ICC 1450 Remote Virtual Inspection for Energy and Water Performance (NEW)
- IECC update
  - Code change deadline was October 21, 2021
    - IECC – Commercial: Approx. 260 proposals
    - IECC – Residential: Approx. 170 proposals
  - Next steps: Review and recommendation by Subcommittees followed by review and action by the two Consensus Committees

## 7.4 A117.1 (New item added to the agenda)

Jake Pauls raised concerns about the lack of communication being issued by ICC on the update process of the A117.1 standard. It was noted by staff that with the retirement of the A117.1 Staff Secretariat, that position was being filled by the Director of Standards. It was also noted by staff that a meeting notice dated November 10, 2021 was issued along the invite for a virtual meeting to be held December 16, 2021.

## 8. ICC Board Activities - ICC Board liaison report

Director Kris Bridges briefed the IAC on the following:

- Board approval of the restructured process with 2 Committee Action Hearings per Code Group
- With the approval of the restructured process, the Board followed the LTCDP recommendation and took no action on changing the voting majorities of the OGCV where the code change proposal is Disapproved at both the CAH and PCH. Where such occurs, CP28 still requires the code change to be placed on the OGCV ballot.
- Referenced Standards Committee has been sunset
- The new IAC cost impact guide provides valuable guidance for both the experienced code change proponent as well as someone new to the process.

IAC discussion:

- It was noted that the Pittsburgh Annual Conference and Hearings had little mask use. In response, ICC followed the state and local directives. A discussion ensued.
