6. IAC Administration

6.1 Chair's Report

Chair Grill noted that for most businesses, they are getting back to somewhat pre-Covid protocols with still a fair amount of working-from-home and caps on travel. He extended a word of thanks to the Ethics task group.

8. ICC Codes & Standards Activities

8.1 2021 Cycle – Validation process complete, results posted

Process took a little longer than usual as the entire committee was re-constituted.

8.2 2022 Cycle

a. Public Comment Agenda to post August 4th

b. PCH September 14 – 20 Louisville

Staff noted approximately 239 code changes to be on the agenda out of a total of approximately 760 considered at the 2022 CAH.

8.3 2024 Cycle (process restructure – 2 CAH per Code Group)

Staff noted that materials are under development and will be posted. There will be a presentation at the Panel Discussion in Louisville at the Annual Conference,

Jake Pauls raised questions of ICC's administration of the update process for the standard.

 - Wildland-Urban Interface (ICC 605) (part of the ICC 60x portfolio of hazard mitigation standards) - NEW
 - o Rainwater Collection (ICC 805) Update
 - Off-Site Construction MEP (Mechanical, Electrical, Plumbing, Energy and Water Conservation) (ICC 1205) – NEW
 - National Green Building Standard (ICC 700)
 - RESNET/ICC 1450 Remote Virtual Inspection for Energy and Water Performance (NEW)
 - o Sizing Water Distribution, Drainage and Venting (ICC 815) NEW
 - Private Sewage Disposal Systems (ICC 825) NEW
- IECC update
 - O Both committees (Commercial and Residential) have completed their review and action on the Public Input code changes. Next step is the Committee Action Report/Ballot process
 - o Following the ballot process, the Public Comment Drafts for both committees will be posted for code change submittals
- Ad Hoc Committee on Building Safety & Security. The committee has completed its work and the final report is under development. The interim report has been posted on the <u>BSS website</u>.
- Existing building inspections. Staff reported on the Webinar held in December/2021 and the current activity of the development of an Existing Building Inspection Guide.

9. ICC Board Activities - ICC Board liaison report

9.1 Council Policy updates

Staff noted agenda item 2 for meeting conduct.

a. CP 7 Committees and Members (attached)

Staff placed the attachment on the screen citing the change to Section 7.2 requiring full disclosure at meetings. In response, it was noted that the term "meetings" is used which does not include ICC's CAH and PCH hearings.

b. NEW CP 50 Antitrust Compliance Guidelines (attached)

Staff placed the new council policy on the screen noting the intent to ensure compliance with antitrust laws when ICC meetings are held. Jake Pauls took issue with the phrase "reduce quality or innovation" as being out of step with home safety and the APHA.

c. Code of Ethics (attached)

Staff placed the updated Code of Ethics on the screen and identified the changes approved by the Board.

Director Bridges briefed the IAC on the Board review of the reinstatement of CP 37 Ethics as proposed by the IAC and endorsed by the Long-Term Code Development Committee. Director Bridges noted that the Code of Ethics provides the necessary broad verbiage for which the Board can take action on breeches of professional conduct.

Jeff Shapiro disagreed with the Board's action and the lack of response to IAC's request for participation in the Council Policy Review Committee discussion (IAC December 13, 2021 meeting; agenda item 6.2).

Jake Pauls took issue with the phrase "highest ideals" in the introductory paragraph and that the issue of home safety was both an ethical and technical issue.

A motion was made, seconded and approved to request that the Board provide a detailed response as to why the re-instatement of CP 37 was unnecessary.

Lesley Garland, new VP of State and Local Relations and Aaron Davies, new VP of Federal Relations briefed the IAC on the following:

NEW item Virtual vs In-person IAC meetings

Staff noted the history of IAC meetings. Prior to COVID, they were typically in-person in the DC area as that location seemed to work the best for most of the frequent IAC participants. One of the first virtual meetings was actually scheduled as an in-person meeting in DC but due to snow, it was held virtually.

Discussion:

- The current virtual setting seems to work, what's the added benefit to meet in person?
- Can an IAC meeting be held before or after an ICC Hearing/Conference? Staff noted that placing it before a hearing or the Annual Conference requires IAC participants to extend their stay beyond an already long period of time away from office. Scheduling an IAC meeting after a hearing is a challenge due to the uncertainties of hearing progress and completion.
- Can and IAC meeting be held concurrently with an Annual Conference? Staff noted that the AC schedule has become very tight with meetings and activities.

A straw poll with few responses was split between in-person and virtual. Chairman Grill noted we will add this to the next IAC agenda.
